MERCY COLLEGE RECEIVES FOUR-YEAR HRSA GRANT

Mercy College of Ohio received a four-year grant totaling \$740,998 from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to increase the number of peer support specialists and other behavioral health-related paraprofessionals who will work with families impacted by opioid use and other substance abuse disorders. The grant will provide tuition assistance and stipends to students in Mercy College's two-semester Community Health Worker (CHW) program. After completing the CHW certificate, graduates will have the opportunity to be placed in one-year paid apprenticeships that will immerse them in hands-on experiences.

The CHW program is available to Ohio residents with the lecture content provided online.
